

## Cann Bridge School PE and Sports Premium Grant Expenditure Report 2016 – 2017

At Cann Bridge, we recognise the valuable contribution PE makes to our students' health and well-being. The Government have allocated a set amount of money to each school and have stipulated that "schools must spend the funding to improve the quality of the PE and sport activities they offer their pupils, but they are free to choose the best of way using of the money." (Department for Education, Sept 2013)

We have used the key indicators set by the DFE to inform our decisions on how to spend the funding and to help us to assess the impact on children's PE and sport participation and attainment.

### Key indicators

1. *The engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity – kick-starting healthy, active lifestyles*
  2. *The profile of PE and sport being raised across the school as a tool for whole school improvement*
  3. *Increase confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport*
  4. *Broader experience of a range of sport and activities offered to all pupils*
  5. *Increased participation in competitive sport*
- We will ensure that the additional funding provided by the PE and Sport Pupil Premium enhances the provision of each individual within the primary age range
  - We will ensure that teaching and learning opportunities within the PE curriculum meet the needs of all of the students
  - The PE and Sport Pupil Premium funding may indirectly benefit other students in the school not specifically recipients of this grant (Pupils in Years 7-14)
  - The PE and Sport Pupil Premium funding will enable Cann Bridge School to provide additional teaching and learning opportunities outside the usual curriculum provided through the use of appropriate support staff and outside agencies
  - Cann Bridge recognises the need for sustainability in our PE provision and we are committed to using the money in the best way to benefit current and future pupils

Evidence of cumulative, sustainable impact of Sports Premium:

- A Multi Use Games Area has been built on school site (shared with Tor Bridge Primary) that increases the opportunities for sport by adding another suitable area in which to teach.
- Cann Bridge School were awarded School Games Silver Mark in September 2016 for the second year running.
- Staff have received quality input from specialised professionals in targeted areas, for example, athletics and cricket.
- Purchased equipment and appropriate storage allows children to experience increased amounts of high quality PE and physical activity.
